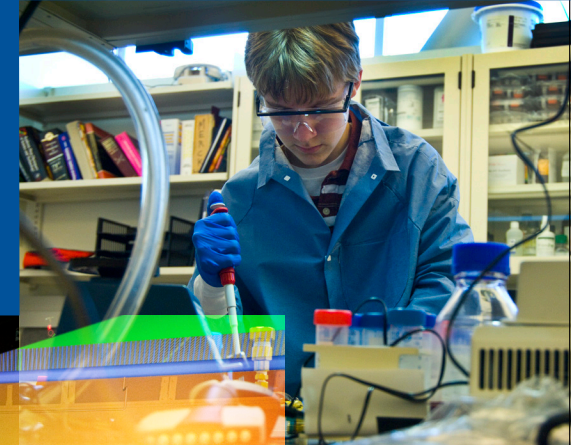
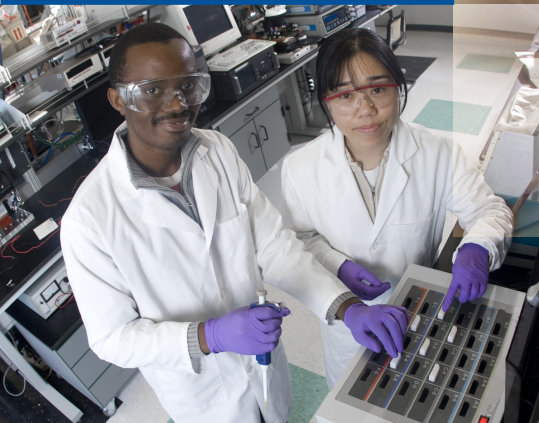
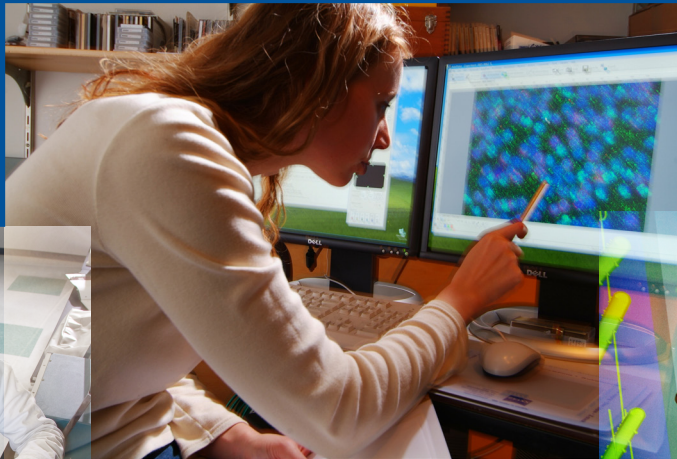

Values

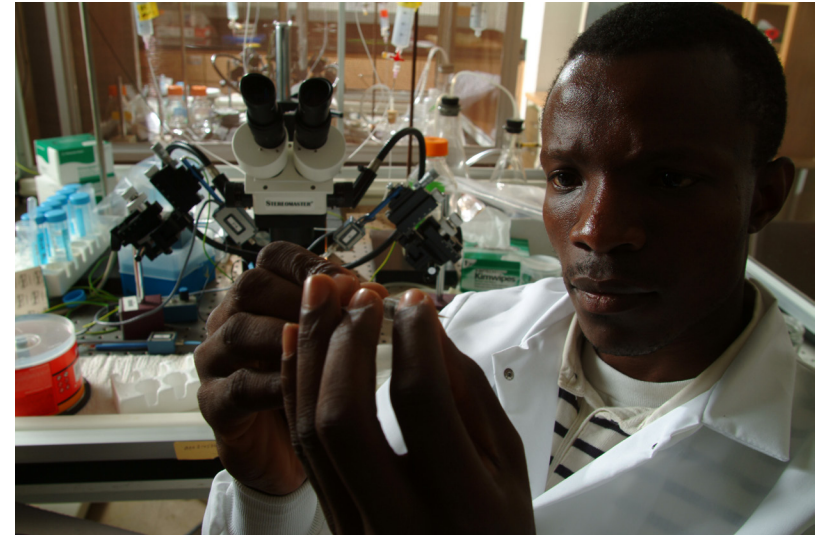
In carrying out its mission, the RF values:

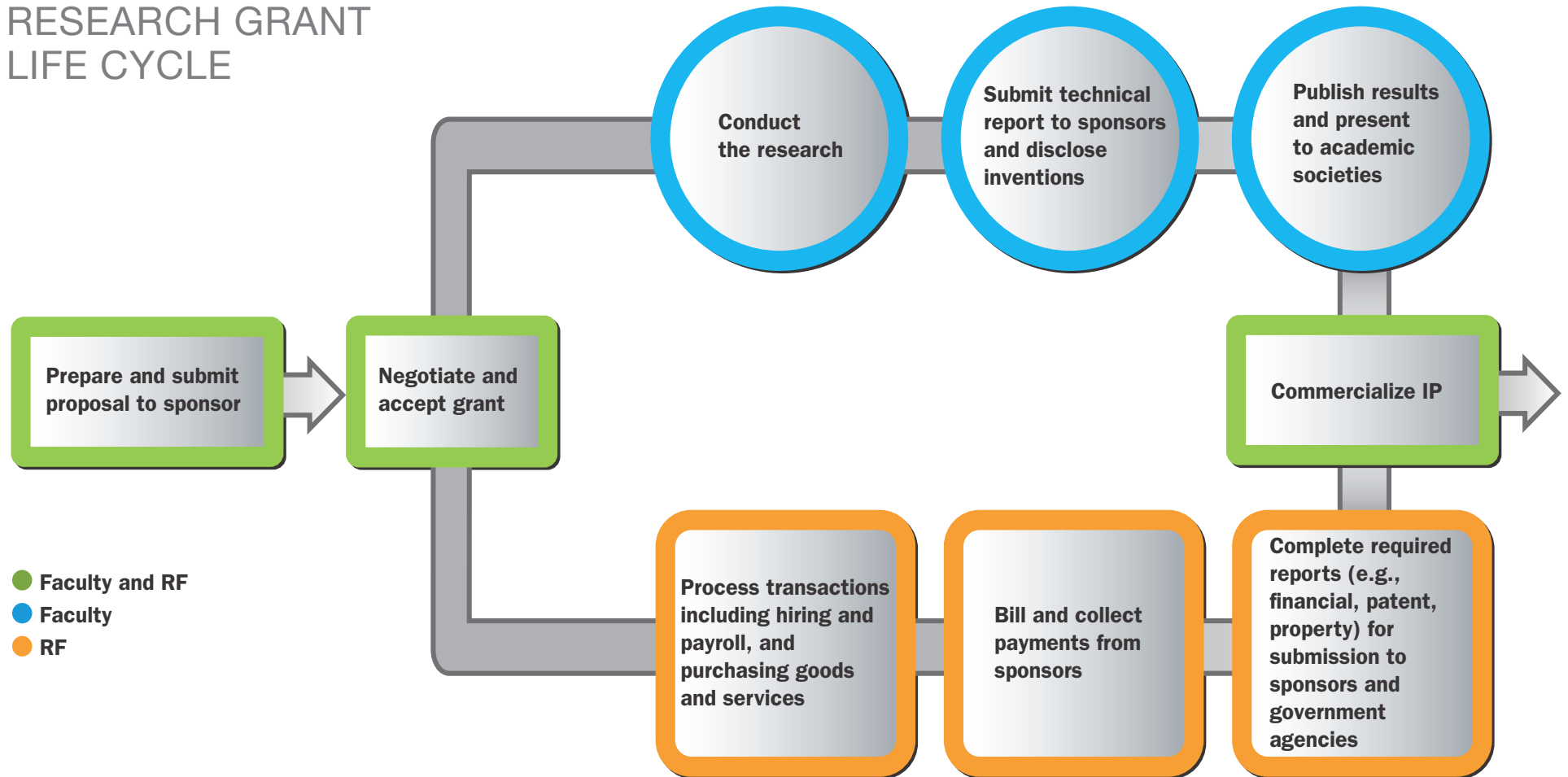

RESEARCH GRANT LIFE CYCLE

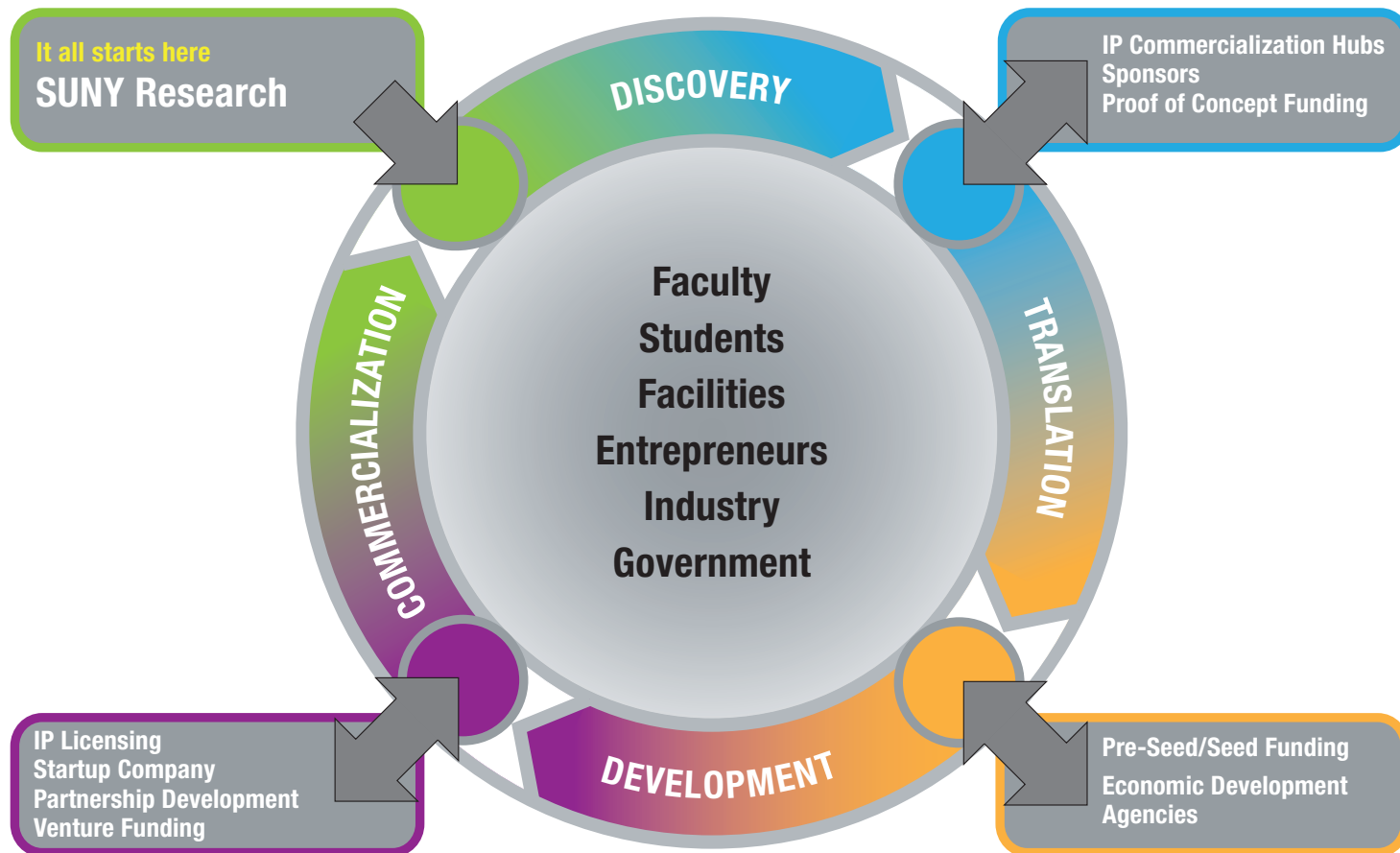


Commercialization Support Services

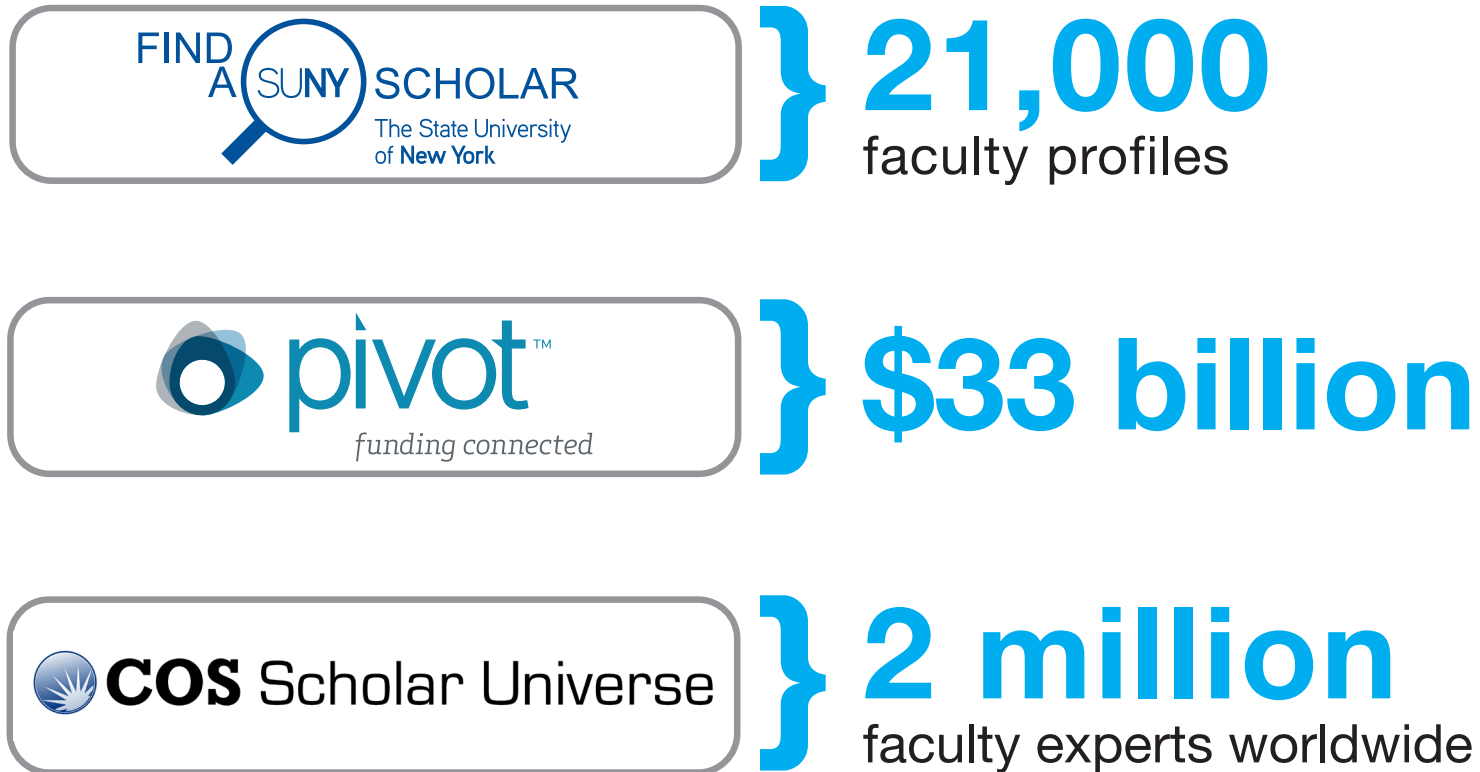

The RF provides SUNY faculty with tools that support greater interdisciplinary cooperation and collaboration within and across the SUNY research community to drive economic growth.

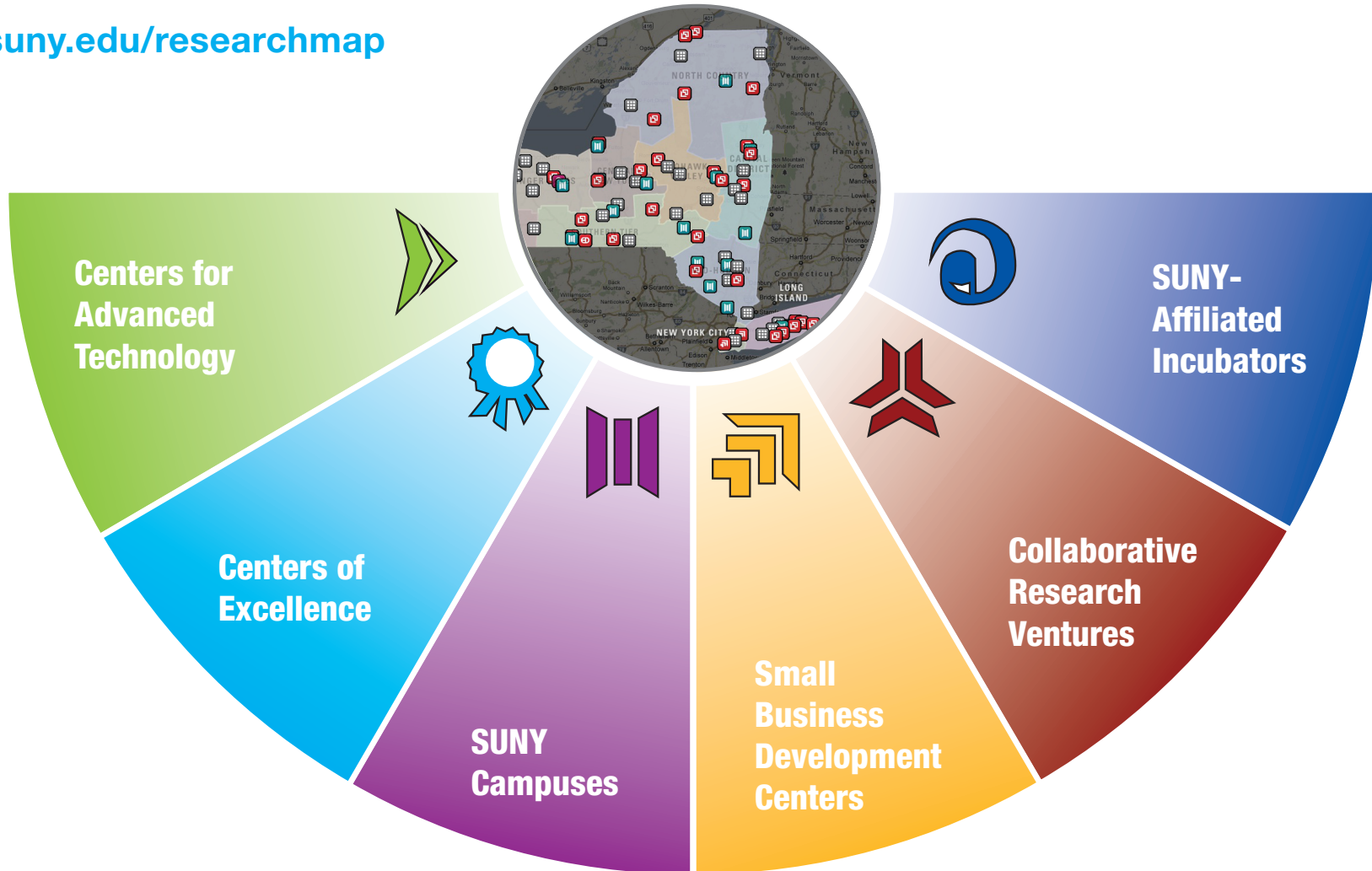

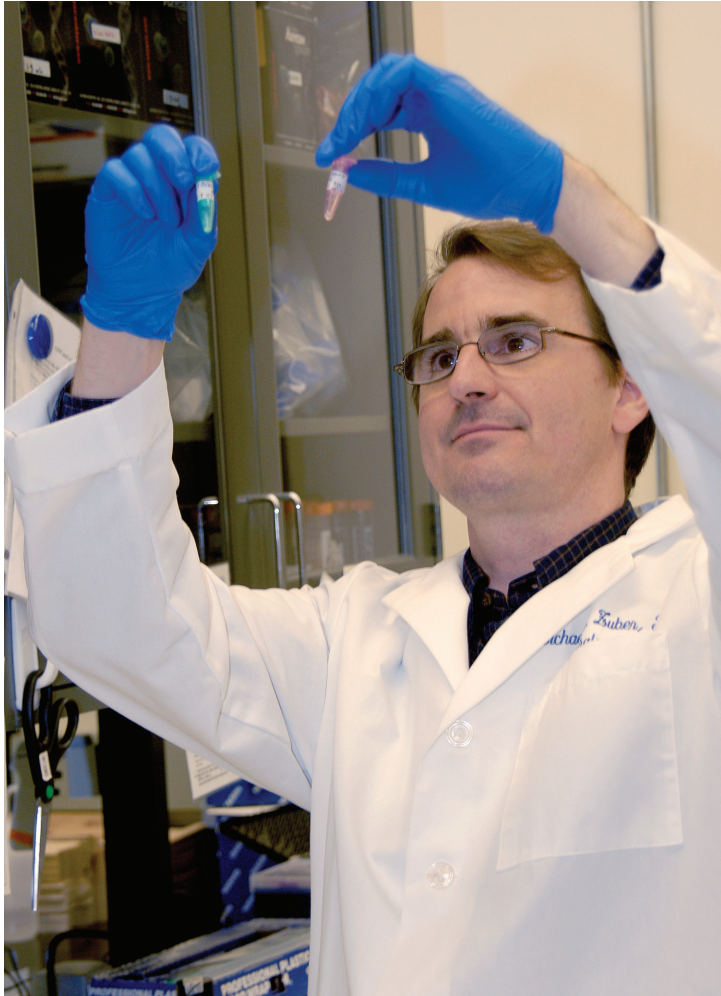

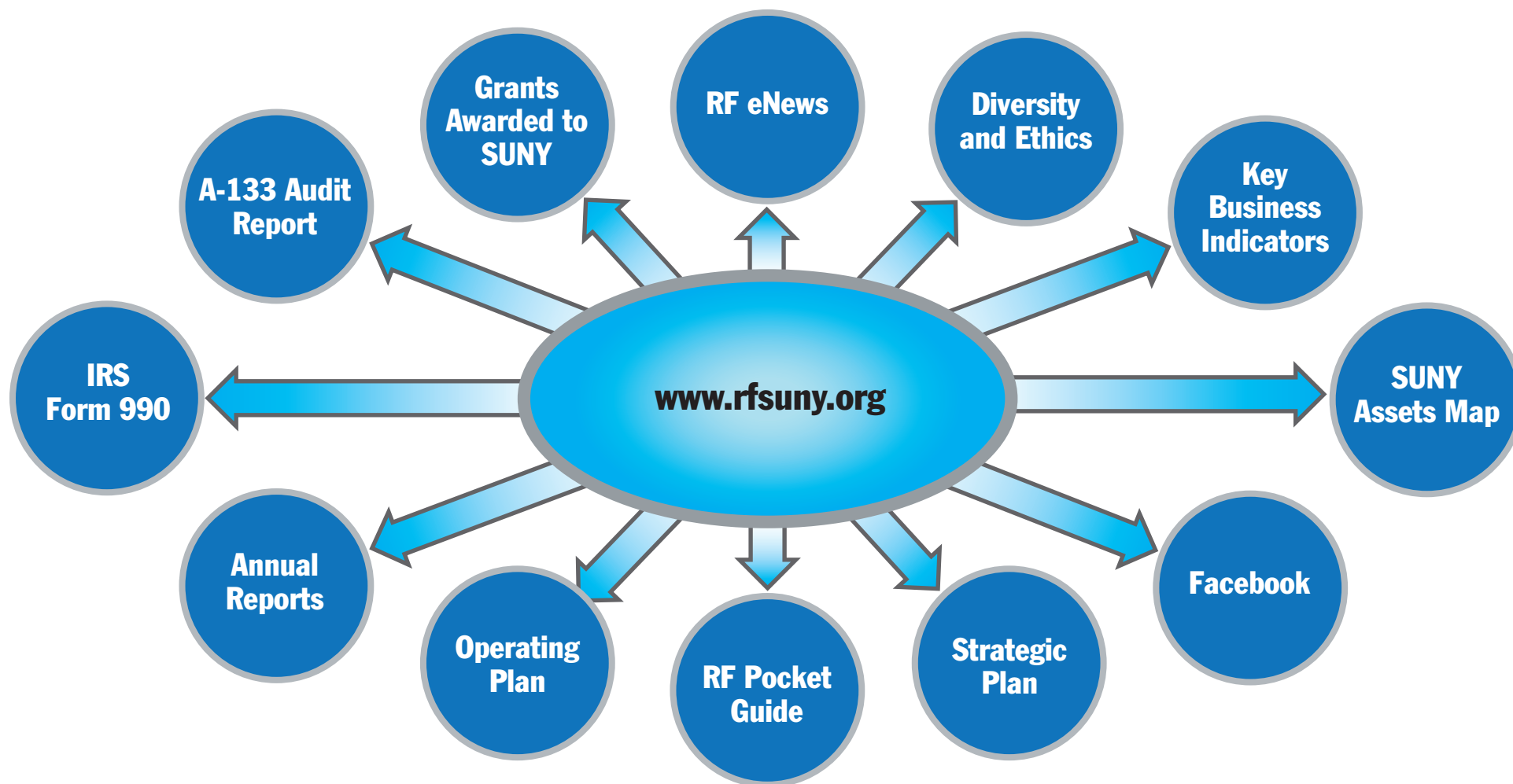
