

The Power of SUNY Incubators



SUNY incubators are a time-tested way to help businesses grow and create jobs in New York. Since opening its first incubator in 1988, SUNY has established a broad array of business incubation programs that tap into local strengths and resources to boost regional economies. Strategically placed throughout the state, SUNY incubators provide guidance and business support, as well as access to space, scientists and research equipment needed to advance innovation and create new products, applications and jobs. Many of the new companies located in these incubators are established by faculty entrepreneurs seeking to commercialize their SUNY-developed innovations.

Long Island High Technology Incubator (LIHTI)



Recognized as one of the most successful business incubators in the world, LIHTI has been associated with more than 70 companies, 44 of which have succeeded beyond their incubator space and four that are publicly traded. LIHTI continues to reinvent the methods used to support the growth of small businesses and continues to forge partnerships with other similarly-purposed organizations on Long Island to expand the innovative capacity of the entire region.

UB Technology Incubator



The UB Technology Incubator at Baird Research Park began operations in 1988 as one of the earliest biotech incubators in the nation. It is fully FDA compliant and has graduated 84 companies which now generate in excess of \$500 million a year in sales with over 500 jobs. The UB Technology Incubator companies operate in a variety of technologies. The incubator has a successful graduation rate over 23 years and is home to one of the few successful pharmaceutical company startups in the state.

iCLEAN Incubator



Funded in part through NYSERDA and supported by the National Science Foundation, iCLEAN serves nanotechnology and clean energy technology startups throughout New York state. Leveraging its partnerships with the U.S. Department of Energy and National Renewable Energy Laboratory, iCLEAN has assisted more than 100 early stage ventures in developing disruptive technologies and pitching their businesses to some of the world's top investors and commercialization partners. In its first 18 months of operation, iCLEAN companies have raised more than \$20 million in private funding and over \$25 million in public funding.

SUNY Fredonia Business Technology Incubator



Fredonia's new Business Technology Incubator is turning traditional sectors of the Chautauqua County economy into a 21st century competitive advantage. Since being constructed in 2009, the Fredonia Incubator is already home to more than a dozen innovative companies, each of which is creating jobs and helping to grow the economy of Western New York. This partnership continues to identify new opportunities for growth and new strategies that will enable long term flexibility and sustainability.



Nelson Farms Incubator

A unique combination of business incubator, food product processing facility and hands-on academic classroom, Nelson Farms fills a huge niche in today's startup business market. Nelson Farms provides entrepreneurial agri-business opportunities for specialty food processors, farmers, growers and producers. These opportunities, which include processing/co-packing, product development, dairy incubator, distribution, marketing and sales, helped nearly 600 businesses bring more than 400 products to market.
